

- 1) £2.6m has been added to the Global Sum taking it now to £183.559m
- 2) £1.1m allocated within the Primary Care Fund for Pharmacy First (UTI and impetigo only) will move into guaranteed remuneration for community pharmacy services
- 3) £20m will be mapped from reimbursement (Drug Tariff) to guaranteed remuneration. Adding this to the similar process carried out last year brings this element of guaranteed funding to £41.1m (£20m 18/19 + £20m 19/20 + £1.1m Pharmacy First).
In total this brings guaranteed funding to £224.659m including the Global Sum.
- 4) Reimbursement guaranteed minimum will be reduced to £80m for 19/20
- 5) 100% of the first £10m over the guaranteed minimum can be retained by the community pharmacy network if market conditions allow. Above £90m the sharing arrangements with Health Boards will apply 50:50.
- 6) To pay back through clawback what was owed to Health Boards a generic rate of 6% will be applied from the 1st of April. This will be monitored to ensure delivery of the agreed amount throughout 19/20.
- 7) Should cashflow be negatively impacted through 19/20 this 6% clawback rate could be adjusted or suspended to support the network

More detail will follow in due course once the breakdown of the funding elements have been agreed. Once this work is complete Scottish Government will issue a more detailed circular and CPS will produce an updated Financial Framework for this year.
